Over 40 different events including Robotics, Welding, Fashion Technology, Carpentry and 3D Computer Animation will take place over the two day competition and tradeshow.

Northern Lakes College is sending two of its most talented students, Kylar Schamp and Troy Beaudoin to compete in Welding and Carpentry competitions respectively, and if successful in winning gold, will join Team Alberta at Nationals in Toronto next month.
