## Advisory: Northern Lakes College Investigating Targeted Phishing Attack

Northern Lakes College was victim to an email phishing attack on September 18, 2017 resulting in the compromise of an administrative staff's email account. Northern Lakes College (NLC) took immediate action to prohibit unauthorized access to the Continuing Education email account in question and launched an internal investigation. NLC reported the incident to the RCMP, contacted the Office of the Information and Privacy Commissioner, and has notified individuals and companies that may have been affected.

"Cyber criminals are attacking businesses daily. Unfortunately, NLC was the victim of a phishing attack," said Bruce D'Sena, Chief Information Officer. "The email looked legitimate, and it came from a customer. We are fortunate that our IT department has strong measures in place and that they took action immediately."

Ann Everatt, President & CEO of Northern Lakes College said, "I want to emphasize that this incident will not impact our academic or business operations in any way. I urge all of our students to be vigilant. Take precautions when using email. There are a number of magazine articles and websites that provide information on how to detect phishing emails."
