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## NLC and Fort Vermilion Public School Collaborate on Housing Project

Northern Lakes College (NLC) and Fort Vermilion Public School are working together on a major renovation project, which involves a Northern Lakes College staff house.

For the past ten years, the Fort Vermilion Public School's very successful housing program has taken on projects that provide their students with trade's experiences that benefit the community. "Our students are gaining work experiences that are practical and are building a foundation for future career choices. Our collaboration with Northern Lakes College on this two year project is providing many students with the opportunity to earn credits and explore career opportunities through hands-on learning," said Grant Charles, Principal of Fort Vermilion Public School.

"Working as a team on a real job site has shown me the level of responsibility that a person needs for a future job," said Deanna Flooren, a Fort Vermilion Public School student.

Charles identified the project during a Community Education Committee (CEC) meeting. The Community Education Committees are public advisory committees for the College. The Fort Vermilion Public School showed interest in taking on the project as part of their housing program. Northern Lakes College contributes the materials for the project. Fort Vermilion Public School supplies student manpower and three dedicated instructors who teach students skills in electrical wiring, framing, dry walling and installing flooring.
