Northern Lakes College and Lakeland College Collaborate to Increase Access to Academic Upgrading

Academic Upgrading is the focus of a new collaboration between Lakeland College and Northern Lakes College. Starting this September, Northern Lakes College will offer its Academic Upgrading program at Lakeland's Lloydminster campus. The Academic Upgrading program is for adults whose education is within the grade 4 to 9 level and who want to prepare for their high school diploma, career training or employment.

"We're excited that we're able to collaborate with Northern Lakes College to bring their program to Lloydminster and help people in our community get the education they need to improve their lives," said Brad Onofrychuk, Dean of Business and Continuing Education at Lakeland.

Glenn Mitchell, Dean of Business and Academics at Northern Lakes College said, "We welcome opportunities to partner with Campus Alberta institutions in order to create new opportunities for students. The partnership with Lakeland College will provide students with access to NLC's Academic Upgrading programing, now offered entirely online."

Courses offered within the Academic Upgrading program include communications; science, social studies, and math. There are two start-up dates for the course offerings, September 4, 2018 through January 31, 2019 and February 1, 2019 through June 30, 2019. Up to 15 students will be accepted into the program; applicants will be assessed and placed in their appropriate grade level. Northern Lakes College education counsellors will work with the students individually to determine their education plan.

While the courses are primarily offered online, students will be required to attend class at the Lloydminster campus from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. Monday to Friday. Northern Lakes College will have an instructor on-site at the Lakeland campus to assist students.

To learn more about the program, those interested can attend the information session that will be hosted by Lakeland College on Tuesday, May 15, 2018 between noon and 5 p.m. at the Lloydminster campus (Room BK213). The session will provide participants with information on how to apply, available funding options and testing.
