On the move: NLC Campus finds temporary new home in High Prairie.

Northern Lakes College announces that the High Prairie Central Campus (across from the A&W) is now closed.

Robert LeSage, Vice President of Corporate Services & CFO at Northern Lakes College said: "In the coming weeks, this campus will be demolished to make room for a modern new campus that is tailored to meet the learning needs of our students. Until the new campus is completed, a building has been leased temporarily to provide office and classroom space beginning this fall."

During the summer, staff have relocated to NLC's Health Learning Centre while renovations take place in the leased building to accommodate students and staff. The temporary campus will be their home for the next three years, and is located at 5017 – 43 Avenue in High Prairie, where the Horizon Credit Union once was (across from Freson Bros IGA). This location will open effective September 4th, 2018, and will be the temporary home for the High Prairie Central Campus while construction takes place at the old site.

We welcome the community to join NLC staff on September 11, 2018, at 12 pm, for a BBQ at the new location to welcome students to their temporary new campus.

Northern Lakes College is a multi-campus college located in northern Alberta and is focused on providing relevant, quality programs through a distributed learning model, serving over 6,000 students annually.
