Objective:	N/A
Guidelines:	Participants in research projects have the following rights:
	to consent to participation without coercion;
	2. to be fully informed about the project, except under special circumstances;
	3. to be provided with opportunity to assess risk;
	4. to withdraw from the research without penalty of any kind (including loss of
	agreed upon monetary reimbursement or other incentives);
	5. to be fully informed of the degree of anonymity;
	6. to have access to the research results; and
	7. to adhere to the Tri-Agency Framework for responsible conduct of research.
Definitions:	Minimal risk is defined as, "research in which the probability and magnitude of
	possible harms implied by participation in the research is no greater than those
	encountered by participants in those of their everyday life that relate to the
	research." ¹
