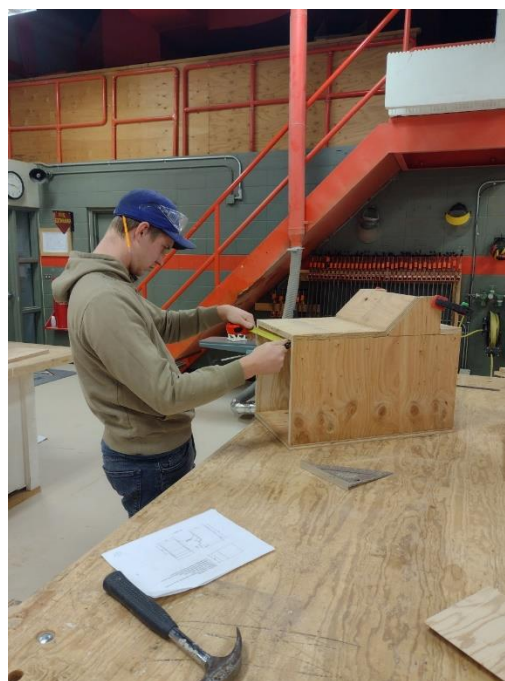




Information about the Dual Credit Carpenter Program From Northern Lakes College

Why take dual credit Carpenter?

- ✓ Earn up to 15 high school credits toward your high school diploma.
- ✓ Upon successful completion of all NLC courses, students are eligible to challenge the 1st Period Carpenter Apprenticeship exam from Apprenticeship & Industry Training (AIT). With the successful completion of the written/practical exams required by AIT, you will have finished the technical training of a 1st Period Carpenter apprentice.
- ✓ At this point, you will be a registered apprentice and receive your “BLUE BOOK” to record your achievements and progression through the full apprenticeship. This document is transferrable between employers.
- ✓ Improves your chances of employment in the carpenter trade after high school.
- ✓ Save money. Your high school may cover some costs. Check with your school to determine if they cover any expenses.
- ✓ Qualify for a \$500 tuition bursary. Students who successfully complete a Dual Credit course qualify for a tuition bursary if they continue their post-secondary education with Northern Lakes College.

Prerequisites:

- Minimum of English 10-2 AND Math 10-3.
- Recommend students have English 30-2, Math 30-3, Science 20, Physics 20, or Chemistry 20.
- Enjoy hands-on activities and working with tools.

Program Overview:

- The Carpentry trade is a highly qualified industry requiring personal dedication and perseverance. Attention to detail and mathematical calculations are integral to a successful career as a Carpenter.
 - Students are advised to develop a daily routine that enables them to complete assignments on time and attend classes to improve their skill level and successfully complete (pass). A qualified instructor will be on-site to supervise and mentor throughout the program.
- It is very important to know:
 - Steady, consistent, and full participation are the keys to your success.
 - Coming to school prepared. Being prepared means that you are on time, have your homework completed, bring/ wear the proper safety attire in the shop, and are ready to participate in the classroom and lab.
 - NLC program requirements have strict guidelines to ensure students are successful and safe in the program. Students must adhere to the roles and expectations found in the program handbook.
 - Attending experiential lab sessions is mandatory, but exceptions are acceptable due to illness or crisis. The Instructor will review absences over one day. Excessive absences or unacceptable behaviour may lead to dismissal.



Program Details:

- Students will follow the schedule as laid out by the College while in the program.
- Dual credit students may be in class with adult Pre-Employment or Apprenticeship students.
- When in the shop, students must have CSA approved above the ankle steel-toed boots, appropriate cotton work shirts and full-length work pants that are in good condition and can go over the boots. Spandex or nylon material is NOT permitted.
- Students must wear all mandated Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) as per NLC OH&S Guidelines during the experiential lab sessions.
- To challenge the AIT exam, one must pass the NLC courses with a 65% average and score 65% or higher on the NLC final exam.
- AIT requires a minimum of 70% to pass their written/practical exams successfully.
- Students are encouraged to apply early as the classes can fill up before the application deadline.
- Students and parents may request an orientation/information session before beginning the program. Please get in touch with the trades department to make your appointment. at tradesaccount@northernlakescollege.ca.
