### ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

#### Academic Requirements (must be 18 years of age with):

- 60% in English 30-1 or 70% in English 30-2 or 60% in ENG 0190
- Or an assessed English equivalency
- All post-secondary transcripts must accompany the application

**OTHER REQUIREMENTS:** It is strongly recommended that students have a home computer, webcam and access to high speed internet. Students without basic computer skills will be encouraged to attend a computer skills workshop prior to the start of the program. • Practicum agencies may require a Police Information Check and an Alberta Children's Services Intervention Record Check of students placed in their organizations. The inability to present clear checks may prevent a student from completing the program requirements. Contact the Program Coordinator for further information. • Because of the nature of the program, students must not be abusing alcohol or drugs for at least 1 year prior to applying. Additionally, students must not abuse alcohol or drugs for the duration of the program.

**DEADLINES:** Applications must be submitted at least 2 weeks prior to the term start date. Payment and course registration are required at least 10 business days prior to the term start date. If funding is required, applicants are advised to apply early. Students must start the program in September.

**APPLICATION PROCESS:**

- **APPLICATION:** Complete and submit the Northern Lakes College application online on the college website [www.northernlakescollege.ca](http://www.northernlakescollege.ca)
- **TRANSCRIPTS:** Provide an official high school and/or post-secondary transcript. This must be forwarded directly to Northern Lakes College, Admissions Services, from the granting institution (there may be a charge for this). When transcripts are received at NLC, they are reviewed to determine if the academic requirements for admission to the program are met.
- **ENGLISH ASSESSMENT:** If the English requirement is not met then an equivalency assessment can be completed. The College uses ACCUPLACER for the English requirement. If testing is required, the applicant will be informed and they will need to make an appointment by calling Admissions.
- **ACCEPTANCE:** Applicants who meet the academic and other admission requirements will be accepted and offered a space in the program. These applicants will be accepted in the order of "first qualified, first served." Applicants will receive a letter informing them of their acceptance status.
- **TUITION & COMMITMENT DEPOSITS:** Accepted applicants in all career programs will be required to complete registration forms within one month of receiving their acceptance letter. This registration includes a \$100.00 (domestic student) or \$300.00 (international student) commitment fee deposit. This fee is non-refundable and will be applied towards the terms' tuition. Applicants who do not pay their commitment deposit within 4 weeks of acceptance may forfeit their seat in the program. A Tuition Deposit is required for students in an oversubscribed program, this includes our Addictions Counselling program. This non-refundable fee is due May 1 and is \$300.00 for domestic students and \$900.00 for international students. Again, once the term has begun this deposit fee will be applied towards the students' tuition.

•**FUNDING:** Applicants are encouraged to check on funding options early (minimum of 2 months prior to the program start date). Applicants should visit <http://studentaid.alberta.ca/> for loans, grants and provincial scholarships. Northern Lakes College also offers awards for our students. Specific awards related to this program include: CCEC Partnership Bursary, Roland Gladue Memorials Scholarship and the TransCanada Partnership Award.
