TRANSFERABILITY: Graduates of the Practical Nurse diploma may be eligible for acceptance into the Post LPN-BN program at Athabasca University (AU) with a minimum of 30 credits of advanced standing or into the Bachelor of Professional Arts with 45 credits of advanced standing. Individuals are still required to meet all admission requirements prior to acceptance into the AU program. Graduates are eligible to receive 57 credits from Thompson Rivers University toward a Bachelor of Health Science and 60 credits toward a Bachelor of General Studies. Potential students should speak to a program advisor for further clarification of transferability.

METHOD OF DELIVERY: This program is delivered using a blended delivery combining face-to-face and distance learning. This delivery method allows students to pursue their educational goals in selected communities; however, students in the program are likely to have to relocate for short periods of time to another community in order to complete the clinical requirements of the program or travel to meet the requirements for nursing lab experiential learning. ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS: Applicants must have the following courses or equivalents:

- 60% in English 30-1 or 70% in English 30-2 or 60% in English 0190 or an assessed English equivalency (ACCUPLACER);
- 50% in Math 20-1 or 60% in Math 20-2 or 60% in MATH0190 or assessed Math equivalency (ACCUPLACER);
- 60% in Biology 30 or 60% in BIOL0190 or (50%) in ANPY1000 or assessed Biology equivalency (ACCUPLACER);
- and have fluency in English

CLINICAL REQUIREMENTS: Applicants will be required to provide the following forms prior to clinical practicum:

- Immunizations Record: must be up-to-date

- Police Information Check: including Vulnerable Sector check, completed within 3 months and will be required during the first term of the program. (NOTE: students without a clear criminal record will not be able to complete the practicum requirements of the program.)
- CPR for Health Care Providers (Level C) - must be current
Students who enter this program should also have basic computer skills (the ability to use the Internet, e-mail, and a word processor).

APPLICATION PROCESS:

- **APPLICATION:** Complete and submit a Northern Lakes College application on the College website at www.northernlakescollege.ca (follow: <https://www.northernlakescollege.ca/apply-now/program-applications>) or through Apply Alberta (APAS).
- **TRANSCRIPTS:** Provide any official high school and/or post-secondary transcripts. These must be forwarded directly to Northern Lakes College, Admissions Services, from the granting institution (there may be a charge for this). When transcripts are received at NLC, they are reviewed to determine if the academic requirements for admission to the program are met.
- **CLINICAL REQUIREMENTS:** Applicants who meet the academic requirements will be expected to provide the following forms: criminal record check, health status form and immunization record, prior to clinical practicum courses. Applicants also need to provide copy of CPR for Health Care Providers certificates.

- **EQUIVALENCY ASSESSMENT:** If the English, Math or Biology requirements are not met, then an equivalency assessment can be completed. The College uses ACCUPLACER for the English, Math and Biology requirement. If testing is required, the applicant will be informed and arrangements must be made for writing the test.
- **ACCEPTANCE:** Applicants who meet the entrance requirements will be accepted and offered a space in the next available offering of the program. In some cases, the spaces at a specific location may be full and accepted applicants will be placed on a waitlist. These applicants will be accepted in the order of "first qualified, first served" basis. It may also be possible to transfer to another location if there is space. Applicants will receive a letter informing them of their acceptance status.
- **REGISTRATION & COMMITMENT FEE:** Accepted applicants in all career programs will be required to complete registration forms within one month of receiving their acceptance letter. This registration includes a \$100.00 (full-time) or \$75.00 (part-time) commitment fee deposit. This fee is non-refundable.
- **FUNDING:** Applicants are encouraged to check on funding options early (a minimum of 2 months prior to program start date). Counsellors can assist with identifying funding options and applying for sponsorship of fees and living costs. Specific awards related to this program include: CCEC partnership Bursary, Roland Gladue Memorial Scholarship, TransCanada Partnership Award. - **ORIENTATION:** Before the start date of the program, accepted applicants will receive information about orientation dates, times, locations and other information to assist them in planning. Students must attend orientation at one of the specified dates and locations.
