PROGRAM LENGTH: 30 weeks (Fall & Winter 15-week terms plus intersession)

BRIEF DESCRIPTION:

Start a university education in your community and save wear and tear on your vehicle! You can take your first 2 years at Northern Lakes College instead of going to a major center. Our university transfer courses are accessible, affordable, and convenient. Class sizes are small, and instructors are helpful and caring. You can earn university credits towards a Northern Lakes College certificate or diploma. Credits can be transferred into these programs: Addiction Services Worker, Community Health Promotion, Early Learning and Childcare, Educational Assistant, Emergency Medical Technician, Practical Nurse, or Social Work. You can also transfer the university credits to another institution, into programs such as Aboriginal Studies, Arts, Education, General Studies or Social Work. To start planning your university education, please meet with our Program Advisor.

TRANSFERABILITY:

PROGRAM DELIVERY:

The program is offered to selected campuses using a mix of distance and blended delivery strategies. The strategies include: • Internet based programs i.e. Moodle & Blackboard/Collaborate; • Self-directed study; • Instructor led face-to-face classes; • Onsite and online tutorial support.

Note: Classes are usually scheduled in 3-hour blocks once per week. Some classes are scheduled for evening delivery and some spring term classes are offered in 3-week blocks of study.

ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- English 30-1 (60%), or English 30-2 (70%) or English 0190 (60%) or an assessed English equivalency.
- **If English is a second language, please refer to the International Student Information.**

Any particular transfer opportunity into a diploma or degree program may have other admission and pre-requisite requirements, including High School math and science requirements. These requirements will be discussed with a University Studies Advisor when meeting with program advisor to choose courses.

APPLICATION PROCESS:

- **APPLICATION:** Complete and submit the Northern Lakes College application form (available at all Northern Lakes College locations and on the College website at www.northernlakescollege.ca). Applications can be faxed to 780-751-3355 or emailed to studentrecords@northernlakescollege.ca
- **TRANSCRIPTS:** Provide an official high school and/or post-secondary transcript. This must be forwarded directly to Northern Lakes College, Admissions Services, from the granting institution (there may be a charge for this). When transcripts are received at NLC, they are reviewed to determine if the academic requirements for admission to the program are met.
- **SKILLS APPRAISAL ASSESSMENT:** If transcripts are not available or do not show the academic requirements, applicants may complete a skills appraisal test. The College uses ACCUPLACER for the English entrance requirement. If English testing is required, the applicant will be informed. Arrangements for writing the ACCUPLACER test can be set up at any Northern Lakes College location at a time most convenient for the applicant. English Equivalency Assessment is comprised of a vocabulary test and an essay to be submitted if academic requirements are not met. - **INTERVIEWS:** An interview will need to be scheduled with the Program Tutor or Program Advisor to choose courses.
- **ACCEPTANCE:** Applicants who meet the academic requirements will be accepted and offered a space in the next available offering of the program. In some cases, the spaces at a specific location may be full and accepted applicants will be placed on a waitlist. These applicants will be accepted in the order of first qualified, first served. It may also be possible to transfer to another location if there is space. Applicants will receive a letter informing them of their acceptance status.
- **REGISTRATION & COMMITMENT FEE:** Accepted applicants in all career programs will be required to complete registration forms within one month of receiving their acceptance letter. This registration includes a \$100.00 (full-time) or \$75.00 (part-time) tuition deposit (commitment fee). **This deposit/fee is non-refundable.**
- **FUNDING:** Applicants are encouraged to check on funding options *early (minimum of 2 months prior to program start date)* and are responsible for forwarding any sponsorship letters to Admissions as soon as possible. Counselors can assist with identifying funding options and applying for sponsorship of fees and living costs. Specific awards related to this program include: Xerox University Studies Entrance Scholarship, CCEC Partnership Bursary, Diane Garratt Bursary, AHSF – Dr. McPherson Award, AHSF – Laurence Decor Award, AHSF-Louise McKinney, Roland Gladue Memorial Scholarship, TransCanada Partnership Award, and Shell Awards.
