Northern Lakes College recognizes National Day for Truth & Reconciliation with launch of Virtual Indigenous Student Centre

Slave Lake, Alberta (September 29, 2023): Northern Lakes College recognized National Day for Truth and Reconciliation during the week of September 25 to 29 with the launch of mamawapowin, the Virtual Indigenous Student Centre. Mamawapowin is a Cree word which means "the act of coming together or an organized meeting." This unique virtual space, accessible to all, has been created to support Indigenous students and those who want to learn about Indigenous culture. Visitors to the site will learn about Indigenous arts, the Elders in Residence program, and Indigenous Library resources, check out featured Indigenous authors, and read Indigenous student success stories. The College also maintains a webpage, "Learn About Truth & Reconciliation", with the purpose of increasing awareness about truth and reconciliation and the legacy of residential schools. Students and staff wore Orange Shirts the week of September 30 to recognize the experiences of children who were taken from their families and placed in residential schools. The College also hosted an online art evening on September 27 with Métis artist, Angela Hall. The session, Rites of Passage Mandala, focuses on self-actualization, freeing the mind and emotions from the past, and renewing one's source of empowerment through art.
