Policy Statement:

Northern Lakes College supports a teaching, learning, and research environment that allows for the free expression of ideas, without inappropriate limitations or fear of reprisal, and which respects institutional integrity and rigorous standards of inquiry. Academic institutions implement academic freedom policies to promote the free communication of knowledge, the development of critical thought, and the institution's role in the community.

Objective:	This policy serves as a guideline for implementing and respecting academic freedom in a way that balances the free expression of ideas with the institution's responsibilities and duties to the accepted standards of the profession and the institution's mandate and mission.
Guidelines:	1. Scope: This policy is applicable to all individuals associated with the College, whether they are full-time or part-time employees, members of the Academic and Support Staff, sessional workers, administrative staff, contractors, consultants, volunteers, or students.
	2. Rights vs. Responsibilities: Provide guidelines for the legitimate exercising of academic freedom and the corresponding responsibility to the standards of the profession, to the institution, and to legal administrative principles.
	 Academic Freedom Entitlements: Provide guidelines for the entitlements shared by all, including freedom to conduct research and other scholarly inquiry and to participate in institutional governance, as well as those specific to: A. faculty, regarding autonomy over pedagogical approaches, including curriculum and assessment; B. staff, regarding autonomy over the completion of work assignments; and
Definitions:	C. students, regarding freedom to discuss in class relevant subject matter. N/A
