Objective:	Northern Lakes College is committed to maintaining high standards of academic
	performance and non-academic conduct to foster a learning environment conducive
	to the development of our students. Our commitment is founded on the principles of
	fairness, trustworthiness, honesty, respect and responsibility. Students are expected
	to guide themselves by these principles in the work that they submit and the
	behaviour in which they engage. This policy directs the investigation of cases of
	alleged academic and non-academic misconduct.
Guidelines:	The Board of Governors values an environment conducive to learning and
	teaching for both distance and onsite environments. The environment must be
	based on civility and mutual respect. It must also be based on respect for:
	A. diversity and intellectual inquiry,
	B. property (including intellectual property),
	C. maintenance of individual safety, and
	D. equitable, unbiased and timely resolution of violations.
	2. Student conduct is not reviewed in isolation. Considerable attention must be given to the laws of Canada, Alberta, and municipalities. E.g. The Alberta Human Rights Act. Students on practicum are also subject to the policies or regulations of assigned practicum sites.
	3. Each student, upon enrollment in the College, is governed by the rules and regulations of the College. Students are expected to conduct themselves in a manner consistent with the educational objectives of the College in accordance with generally accepted standards of behaviour, and in accordance with published College policies, procedures and regulations. At the heart of accepted standards of behaviour is respect for other members of the College community.
	4. The College will ensure that students are aware of their rights, but also the responsibilities that they bear by virtue of their membership in the College

	community.
	5. All employees of the College who interact with students should be familiar with this policy and related documents and able to advise students of their rights and responsibilities when required.
	6. Where policies, procedures or regulations have been violated, the College will utilize fair and efficient procedures to address academic and non-academic disciplinary matters.
	7. The President has the authority to investigate all issues related to students' rights and responsibilities. This authority may be delegated to appropriate program employees.
	8. Students have the right to appeal as per the Student Appeals Procedure.
